I. Officer reports:

A. Chatelaine: I have checked the Atlantian Chatelaine's page and Yseult is still listed for Bright Hills. I have not received any personal notification from the Office. I am glad we made copies in case there are questions about the re warranting. We have been approached by Sir Daveed/ D. Korup who works at Port Discovery in Baltimore, about a demo on 10/30. Mistress Jean has informed him that is the date for T'N'T. He is in need of a few fighters willing to be conquered by the kids using boffers, and thus earning a scroll listing them as "sir" and "lady". I have not received any other requests for demos, but school re opens next month and I expect we will get the usual calls.

B. Chronicler: It is very quiet given the summer season when we don't host any local events. I will do the August Yeoman before I leave for Pennsic but if anyone would like to send extra helpful tidbits learned at land grab please do so. Remember that I need Baronage letters of intent by August 15th along with a picture if you have one... if not I will bring my camera with me tomorrow night July 16th and Friday August 20th to take your portrait if you would like to come to fighter practice all spiffed up in the air conditioning.

E. Marshalls: All marshalls are being requested to update their information on the website.

1. Heavy: Fairly quiet at practice. Gearing up for Pennsic.

2. Archery: Sunday practice was well attended last week with 10 archers. Dun Carraig's Challenge of the Heart was well attended with 21 archers. Seamus, Janyn, Godai, Reyne and Pietre all won prizes in their rank. We have a royal round target and stand to donate to the new Canton. As soon as my warrant as a teaching marshal is posted, I will make arrangements for a teaching session to get new marshalls warranted in the Canton. Classes will also be held in Bright Hills for those who need to renew their warrants.

3. Equestrian:

F. MOAS- July has been reasonably active with classes but as the vacation season and Tourney season go into full swing we have had to juggle our schedules a bit.

EVENTS and DEMOS: No Events or Demos this month.

CLASSES:

June 25th - Silk Painting 101 - taught by Lady Reyne Telarius the students supplied a design and copied and painted it on a layer of silk stretched onto a fan frame. It was extremely popular with 9 students and all the fans were completed by the end of the session.

July 2nd - Indian Women's Garb - taught by Lady Catriona this class covered the wearing and wrapping of Sari's, choli's and additional pieces of garb worn by Indian women. Students practiced wrapping the Saris, worked on adjustments to the Choli's so they would be a bit more modest and still comfortable and learned some of the helpful hints to make the Sari's drape more attractively and to be pleated correctly. There

was much fun wrapping each other up. There were 6 or 7 students. This class was meant to offer the ladies a possible Sumer alternative garb that would be cool, comfortable and attractive.

July 16th - Greek Garb - Taught by Lady Faye de Trees this class covered patterns, tying patterns, information on fibula (pins to hold the pieces together) and more suggestions for easy to wear, comfortable Summer garb. There were several students.

Guild Activities;

Armorer's Guild - Very spotty, but has been working with Steven this afternoon, polishing a helmet.

Clothier's Guild - The Choli and Sari class apparently went well and I will have a few saris with me at the Greek Garb class July 16th. This is the last class for super easy cool garb for hot weather ie. Pennsic then in August we will jump right in to Burgundian Garb in preparation for TNT. The 15th Century fitted kirtle is the base layer for the Burgundian Gown and that class will start early at 7pm on August 20th due to the time it takes to fit the body block

Cooks' Guild - Met yesterday and did a bread-making workshop at Lady Wynn's church. We talked about trying to schedule some classes for the fall on Friday nights. It looks like University will not happen in August due to difficulty finding a site, so the Cook's Guild will be using that weekend for Trial by Fire. That will also be the next meeting as well. The Cooks also decided to contribute \$50 to the Barony. We had a meeting on June 6th where we discussed upcoming feasts- the Metalsmithing Symposium, TnT, etc. and Bread Making Day. We helped at Storvik Novice Tourney (6/19) with Bruce as Head Cook and made a marvelous lunch and feast. Our next meeting is July 17th in the kitchens of the First Lutheran Church of Towson for Bread Making Day (and a knife skills class).

Illumination Guild -

PAGE - (Performing Arts) - PAGE shared food and music on both June 20th and 27th, and had a 4th of July picnic together in Towson, where we discussed our summer schedule and costuming for the new Chalice play. We will not officially meet again until after Pennsic.

TAG - (Textile Arts) - On hold, no July meeting, and there will be no August meeting due to work done on the house. We will resume in September.

Woodworker's Guild - (Woodworking Arts) - no report

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS of NOTE: Dance has been cancelled until September when the monthly sessions will resume. At Summer University # 77 6/12 m'lord William Scolari presented 2 very well received classes, "Survey of the University System in Medieval Europe" and "Introduction to Natural Philosophy in the Middle Ages" and will also be teaching at Pennsic University. Besides these items the various machines, needles and thread and well sharpened scissors are hard at their tasks of creating all manner of new or revived garb for Pennsic.

My 2nd Quarter report has been sent in to the KMOAS as of 7/13/10.

G. MOL: Nothing's happened in the last month. I don't expect much to happen until TNT, aside from activities outside of the Barony, if I am needed.

H. Webminister: We have a website, and it is up-to-date.

I. Seneshal: Lord Richard is going to try to find another site for another University session. We have no word on Unevent yet. I contacted their Royal Highnesses and Kingdom Seneschal asking if we could do our polling earlier, before Thanksgiving, in order to give the future Baron and Baroness time to prepare for Investiture, and am awaiting a response. I talked to the Pastor, and they are still happy with us. I made a request to have a duplicate key made for the hall, and the Pastor approved so long as I keep it in my possession. The church has made a request for August 13; they might need to use the hall that night, which should not be a problem since it will be the last Friday of Pennsic. The Pastor will know for sure this week.

J. Baroness: I have started posting things about Pennsic. I am making my Pennsic schedule, so if there is an event you would like me to attend, please email me. I will be at N32 again this year, and there will be a notebook saying where I am, if anyone needs me. The Crown asks that all baronage have representation for

the opening ceremonies' procession, and I will be requesting help with this. Please also let me know if anyone earns their do-rags this year by participating for a war point for Atlantia in any discipline. Thursday night is Atlantian court--not Wednesday--and Children's Fete is Wednesday afternoon, and I will submit my copying costs at the August meeting. Whatever coloring pages are left over will be given to our children's activities. Volunteers are welcome between 12 and 5 because there are generally about 400 kids that come through during that time. Volunteers are encourage to wear pink- or rose-colored garb, as the event is in honor of Ariel. At the last Curia, there has been a change to Kingdom law to how baronage terms are handled. To cut back on paperwork, baronage will now serve five-year terms if they so choose. Votes of confidence will not be done unless the crown feels there is a problem, if the group requests it, or if the baronage needs to step down. Votes of confidence, for some groups, can be expensive, and votes of confidence have been unnecessary in a lot of cases. The change will go into effect when published in the Acorn. Baronages will not be required to stay on that long unless they want to. The law is retroactive to all current baronages. It doesn't affect us now, but it will affect our next baronage.

K. Steward: Not much to report on this Hot July Day. Loaned the 20x40 to Highland Ford for Highland river Melee ,(Paper Work on file). Will be Loaning the 20x40 to There Majesties for War week of Pennsic ,need to do another inventory and change some lights on the Barony Trailer .That's about it. As Always in Service to our Fair Barony and Baroness

L. Incipient Canton: no report

II. Old Business:

A. Regalia: Martelle will work on having the baronial cloaks finished for the Investiture. We have the material already. Bec and Martelle will work on cleaning out the baronial stuff before the next Investiture and give people the opportunity to take back any items they made that are no longer in use. It would also be nice to have the banner replaced before Investiture.

B. Unevent: No word yet on the status of our bid.

C. TNT: I have back our signed copy of the contract. I've delegated to the archers and siege people to figure out the fields and may have to nudge them after Pennsic. The announcement will be in the September Acorn, and I will post to our list, the Merry Rose, and for the Yeoman. This year's story has been more of a challenge than last year's. We need the check for the insurance, and we will have that check done today. I will be investigating the insurance on the port-a-potties.

D. Birthday: on-list Archery project- finished, fundraising continues with a silent auction at TNT

TRIAL BY FIRE XIV
Saturday, August 28, A.S. XLV (2010 of the Common Era))

The Challenge: To create a period dish under the conditions found at the PENNSIC WAR

The Categories:

- * **Best Meat (Includes fish and shellfish)**
- * **Best Vegetable**
- * **Best Grain (Includes Bread)**
- * **Best Dessert**
- * **Grand Champion - to be awarded at the Judges' discretion.**

The Rules:

- 1) The recipe must either be:
 - a) published between 650 and 1650 AD. (For the empirically inclined Apicius will be accepted.)
 - b) have all ingredients and cooking methods documented in period.*
- 2) Recipes must be brought to the competition. Please bring at least 3 copies.
- 3) Competitors must bring all ingredients to site and prepare the dish in situ.**
- 4) Dishes must be prepared under conditions as found at PENNSIC. No electric appliances.
Acceptable examples: Grill, Smoker, Dutch Oven or Spit over an open fire (assuming site permits ground fires). If you have questions, please ask.
- 5) You must bring all cookers, pots, pans, utensils, dishes, etc. necessary to prepare your dish.
(NOTE: Please mark all your utensils, dishes, etc., so that the orphans left behind can be reunited with their loved ones.)
- 6) Dish must be sufficient to serve 8 to 10 healthy adults. (No penalty for making more)
- 7) Each competitor may enter only one dish per category, but may enter as many categories as desired.
- 8) All competitors must register on the day of the competition with the Registrar.
- 9) The site will open at 10:00 a.m. for set up and registration.
- 10) Preparation and cooking will begin at 12:00 noon.
- 11) Dishes must be completed and ready to serve at 4:00 p.m.

The Judging:

Judges will be drawn from impartial Notables present. Judging will be blind and will use these criteria.

- 1) Presence of and completeness of Documentation***
- 2) Taste
- 3) Texture
- 4) Presentation
- 5) Bonus points based on the judges' experience in the field of period cooking. For example: if a dish has been religiously copied from a period source despite complexity or cost or if a dish displays notable creativity within a recipe, etc. Prizes will be awarded after the completion of the judging.

The Site this year is the home of Their Excellencies, Master Chirhart and Mistress Jeanne.

Please contact the Bright Hill's Cooks Guild if you have questions or need an ingredient verified.

* "Food" by Waverly Root will be used as the final arbiter for periodicity. There will be a copy on site.

****** No advance preparation is permitted, UNLESS the recipe clearly states that the step requires more than a few hours. Documentation is required.

******* Minimal documentation should include (1) the original recipe; (2) your redaction; and (3) your notes related to any changes made in the recipe and your reasons therefore, and any other pertinent information.

TRIAL BY FIRE XIV

Sunday, August 28, A.S. XLV (2010 of the Common Era)

General Guidelines

The Bright Hills Cooks' Guild sponsors this Challenge. The challenge is to create a period dish under the conditions found at the PENNSIC WAR. This is an opportunity for all those interested to come and cook and compete and socialize. It is also that rare opportunity to recognize that Cooking is a Spectator Sport!

Things to bring:

- * Your recipe (3 copies) and any additional documentation. (NOTE: Minimal documentation should include (a) the original recipe; (b) your redaction or translation; and (c) any notes related to changes you made in the recipe and why, information on the dish or ingredients, the cooking method, etc.)

- * All your ingredients.

- * All the pots, pans, utensils, etc., necessary to prepare your dish. This includes knives, cutting boards, serving dishes, etc. NOTE: please mark what you bring.

- * A table or other surface on which to prepare and cook your dish(es).

- * Chairs (if you wish to be seated).

- * Appropriate cooking accessories – your grill, Coleman stove, smoker, hot pads, towels, etc.

- * Your favorite liquid refreshment (the Guild will provide ice water).

Things to remember:

- * This competition is open to all.

- * Spectators are welcome.

- * Garb Please!

- * Any medications you need (bee sting kits, allergy and asthma supplies, etc.)

- * Our hosts are providing the site and outdoor facilities.

Children

- * We are in favor of them.

- * You are responsible for your own children. The Guild does not provide baby sitting services.

- * There will be no designated space available for children's activities.

- * Because the competition begins early, you should plan to feed yourself lunch. Please bring what you and your family will need to survive until after the judging is complete.

Directions: Take your best route to the Baltimore Beltway (I-695). Take the Northwest Expressway (I-795). Follow this road to the end. Turn North (left) onto Maryland Route 30 (watch for the signs to Hampstead). Hampstead is about 10 miles north. In Hampstead, go through 3 traffic lights. The house will be about ½ block past the third light, on the west (left) side of the road. (NOTE: If you get to the light at Route 482, you have gone too far.) The street address is 1022 South Main Street (which is Maryland Route 30). The house is a large gray and white Victorian, with a brick wall in front and a front porch with white pillars. 



