Bright Hills Business Meeting Minutes December 15, 2009

The meeting was called to order at 4:10 p.m.

Due to weather constraints, this meeting was held via conference call.

The following gentles were in attendance: Lord Magnus McTaggart, Lady Wynne ferch Rhodri ap Hwytell, Chagan Khulan Baghsi, Lord Alexander Fowler, Mistress Jeanne Tenneur de Bec, Baroness Martelle von Charlottenburg, Lady Yseulte Trevelyn, Lady Livia di Samuele, Lord Cairell mac Cormiac

I. Officer reports:

A. Chatelaine: We have had several contacts from interested folks, as well as several folks returning to the SCA. No one from Odyssey School has re-contacted us about the demo.

B. Chronicler: Lady Faye reports that things are going smoothly.

C. Exchequer: Lord Magnus reports that we have money. The Barony is in good shape financially.

1. Steward: Not much to report from the Stewards Office. Want to put new running lights on the trailer in the spring.

D. Herald: Lady Wynne reports that, the next consultation session will be held on Friday, 11/25. The Friday consultations are going well. She is still waiting to hear about devices that were submitted at Pennsic. She has also been working on computer-generated promissory scrolls that can be hand colored, If anyone is interested in becoming a warranted herald, please contact her.

E. Marshall: Nothing to report.

1. Rapier: No report. 2. Heavy Weapons: No report. 3. Archery: We continue to have practices at the Baltimore Bowmen on Sundays and will do so through the winter months as weather permits. Several Bright Hills Archers are preparing a fun shoot for the populace at Pennsic this year. We will have archery at the Baronial Birthday. A special holiday shoot is being planned by the Baroness and is tentatively scheduled for December 27.

F. MOAS- Arts and Sciences continues to be active. Both Master Tristan and Lady Ingeborg have continued teaching their respective specialties every Friday evening. I attended the WAG meeting and Lord Luke and I had great fun turning a bowl. Future possibilities are to do another Marudai making workshop if there is any interest. Other ideas are percolating. Since PAGE also meets at Lord Luke's home I stayed and enjoyed the activities PAGE was working on. I am forbidden to divulge what they are up to but it was much fun. This seems to be the Luke and Nina month as Nina and I drove to Wash., DC to view the exhibit at the Sackler Gallery "Falnama, The Book of Omens". It was stunning. If you have an interest in Persian history or aspects of the Koran -go see it. I was not aware that they had books that, when used in conjunction with the Koran, allowed for all sorts of divination. Fascinating! The exhibit will be there till late January. I also dropped in on the Bright Hills Cooks Guild to see what they were cooking up for Baronial Birthday. The theme is a Middle Eastern Bazaar so it should prove interesting. The feast plans are quite diverse and it should be a tasty feast. Currently there are 5 known A & S activities planned for Baronial Birthday and I anticipate at least one more if the Bardic folks want another competition. I have received confirmation that I am now warranted and thus OFFICIAL. I have begun contacting folks to schedule A & S classes for the next few months.

G. MOL: Report submitted electronically.

H. Webminister:

My long-term goal is to develop the Bright Hills' website so that it reflects the talent, passion, and friendliness of the populace and serves its needs. My goal for the past month was to assess the site with respect to web standards and accuracy of information. As far as web standards go, the coding on the site was outdated and did not meet the current standards of the Worldwide Web Consortium (W3C). This was the reason that so many people were reporting that the site displayed incorrectly or inconsistently. As of this writing, I have converted the site's layout from HTML-only to HTML and CSS in accordance with W3C recommendations and tested the site in Firefox and IE 6-8. All but two of the pages (to the best of my knowledge) have been completely rewritten in HTML.

As far as accuracy of information, I have made corrections where I knew that they needed to be made. With the help of Baroness Chagan, I have been in touch with the guild leaders and have heard back from several of them concerning changes that need to be made to their guild pages. As of this writing, all of these changes have been made. My next step

is to correspond with the officers concerning their pages and any corrections that need to be made. I also need to find out what records I need to maintain concerning publication of personal information on the website and re-establish those records. All of this information was lost when Lady Brienna's computer crashed.

These are my primary goals for the coming month, in addition to reviewing the site's accessibility for the vision-impaired and validating all coding with the W3C. For the long-term I would appreciate greatly hearing ideas from the officers, guild leaders, and populace concerning what changes or additions to the site would make the site more useful and easier to use for them. This will guide my work in the future.

And I believe that's all. It's a bit longer of a report than usual, but it's been a busy month!

I. Seneshal: The barony is busy and healthy. We have identified a successor to Lord Magnus, and a deputy, who are willing to serve the Exchequer office. Milady Bernadette will be applying for a warrant as Exchequer and Lord Cairell will become the deputy. We will be transitioning the office over the next month.

J. Baroness: Report submitted electronically.

A. Day of Dance- 12th Night- (January 2nd)

Preparations are well underway. This will be a pot luck meal. The format will be similar to last year – Bardic interspersed with dance.

She will contact the pastor for clarification, and report back.


Continue west for another block, until you reach Brookdale Road.
