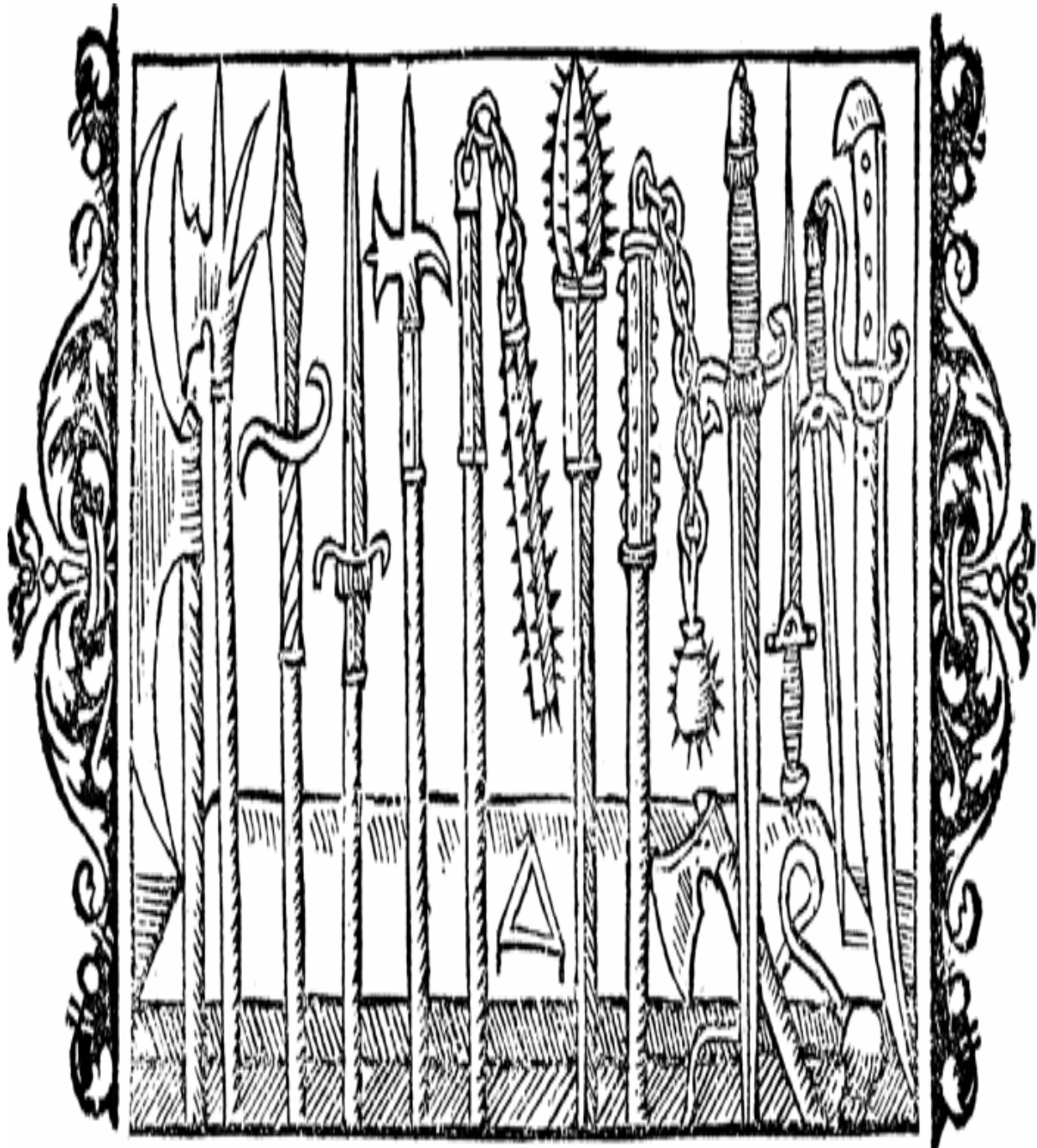

ATLANTIAN SCIENCES GUILD:

I am including the report made to the Atlantian Sciences Guild as this is headed by our own Lord William Scolari:

Greetings everyone!

It has been a while since I have posted and I noticed that we have several new members. So I thought I would let everyone know what I'm doing and encourage everyone else to do the same.

I have been encouraged by the increased visibility that the sciences seem to be enjoying lately. There was a recent article in Tournaments Illustrated about Eratosthenes' famous experiment measuring the circumference of the earth and a modern-day SCA member's recreation of it. There was a two part Compleate Anachronist on the astrolabe (one on theory and one on construction), and the author taught a course on the astrolabe at the winter session of Atlantia University. I hope that this trend continues – that will in large measure

be up to US! We need to teach classes and write articles about what we are doing in the sciences. I hope that this forum can be a catalyst to promote that.

I taught three classes at the winter session of Atlantia University: Introduction to Natural Philosophy, Topics in Natural Philosophy: Cosmology, and History of the University in Western Europe. All were well attended and, I hope, enjoyable for the attendees. (I got good feedback from the attendees, at least.) I will likely NOT be at Pennsic this year because my youngest daughter is expecting my Lady Wife's and my first grandchild around that time. So I won't be teaching any classes there – Anyone want to teach some science classes at Pennsic??????

What am I up to? Short term – I wasn't really satisfied with my Cosmology course, so I am reworking it for the next time I teach it. Long term – I plan on developing some courses on specific topics in natural philosophy and the "exact sciences" of optics and mechanics.

So – What is everyone else up to? What projects are you working on? Do you need help with classes, research, anything else? Stuck – need motivation? Please share your thoughts with us. I would like for this forum to be used for us to help each other. I have a lot of references in natural philosophy, optics, and other sciences. I've also taught a lot – not just in the SCA, but in mundane life. I've also written a lot of technical articles. (My mundane education is a Ph.D. in physics and my mundane job is a defense contractor, so I do a lot of research, writing, and briefing.) I would be happy to help anyone. Others in the group have other strengths and would be happy to help. Together I think we can solve pretty much any problem.

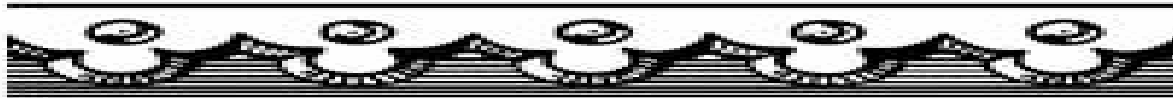
Continue west for another block, until you reach Brookdale Road.
