Officers' Reports

Chatelaine: A busy month for Bright Hills. I sent an invitation to everyone, who had contacted me, to attend University. I received 2 replies, thanking me, and asking to be kept informed of future events. TNT will occur on 10/ 29. I will have flyers and "guest" waivers for any visitors at Troll.

Chronicler: Is behind in Yeomans due to serious real life issues. Deputy (Eithne) will publish a Yeoman in order to keep our obligations to the kingdom.

Exchequer: We have money.

Steward: A tent was requested for University but not used. Baron Heinrich has requested the 20x20 tent for TNT. The inventory sheet has been given to the feast stewards for TNT. Hope to get new signs made for the barony out of wood, if the weather holds.

Herald: Lady Deirdre will be taking over for me, beginning next month. We had a consult table at University with Lady Alexandria. There were 1 badge and 2 name submissions sent to Golden Dolphin. New Golden Dolphin is Mistress Hrothny Rognvaldsdottir. As of yesterday, everything I've sent in is up on the Atlantian comment page. In the past week, I have confirmed most of the submissions in most of our permanent registration file. A few people I couldn't find. I've been working on the baronial badges and comments are favorable. We can use them without registering, as far as I understand; however, if we do want to register them, it is \$10 each, totalling about \$100. I will be passing on all of the files and book boxes to Lady Deirdre after TNT. I have an updated book list of the books owned by the barony. We're going to have a consult table and TNT, and all heralds are invited. It will also serve as Herald's Point. At TNT, I will be stepping down at evening court.

Knight's Marshall:

Archery: Practices were held in the last month. Due to rain several practices were cancelled. This past Sunday we had 20 people at practice, including two from Lochmere, two youths and one archer from the East kingdom. Bright Hill's archers supported Storvik Birthday with the use of our pendulum and the archery net. Janyn Fletcher and Seamus MacRea made targets for the Lochmere arrow competition to be held at TnT. Godai Katsunaga made archery targets for the Champions shoot at TnT. Godai Katsunaga made the award arrows for TnT. Janyn, Baron Barre and Godai taught archery classes at University.

Lady Ingeborg - At Fighter Practice on October 7, 2011, I gave a Viking wire weaving lesson to two people. One learned it and the other intends to have a second lesson to be sure of knowing how to do it. The lovely dancing reduced our time for weaving.

Furnace Town Demo - Chesapeake Celtic Festival:

Lady Ingeborg reports: At the Bright Hills demo last weekend - The Chesapeake Celtic Festival at Furnace Town on Eastern Shore

Over the two days of the festival, I taught 17 people how to do Viking Wire Weaving. I have notes from 15 of them in my 50 for the 50thlog book; I missed getting 2 of them to autograph it. There were intermittent crowds of people watching the lessons -- usually 4 to 10 people at a time. The festival grounds were open from noon to 5 PM both days.

One of my students, an adult woman, learned from me last year and came back this year saying "Oh good, you're here! I forgot how to get it started!" Most of the students were adults; two of the children were a girl (age 8 or 9), and a boy (age 11)--not related to each other. These two surprised me with their intense interest and patience. The little girl was obviously cold but would not leave until she had made her bracelet. (I gave cold students a lap rug.) The weather was lovely on Saturday and bit raw feeling on Sunday, with rain now and again.

The SCA corner of the festival was very popular. Baroness Sweska was always surrounded as she made beads. Of course the fighters of Wulfshaven attracted crowds as their noisy art brought the visitors over and they did many talks on

medieval fighting in-between bouts. (Thank you for tent space for my bed and my classes, Wulfshaven!)

Spiaggia Levantina from Ocean City had an A&S tent with their spinners, weavers, and embroidery demos. Baroness Johanna showed her lovely period gowns and bard Richard provided Medieval music with his voice and guitar.

MOL: University went great with a MoL 101 class in the Barony for a change. Mistress Livia (Sherrill) is working on becoming warranted to be my deputy MoL. TNT event with Rapier and Heavy fighting will be happening at this month's end.

Webminister: All requested updates to the website that I have the necessary information to complete have been completed. Currently, we are planning to add a new page for the canton as well. The baronial charter also requires updating; as soon as I have a copy of the revised text, I will handle this right away. These items are on my agenda for the next month.

I still need to know who is the deputy marshal for heavy fighting and the deputy marshal for equestrian, so that I can contact these folks for permission post their email addresses on the website. I would be most grateful to anyone who can help me find this information.

Canton: I have been out of town, and A&S didn't happen while I was gone. Our meeting had to be moved till next Sunday. The only new thing is the Winter Ball, which made it on the Atlantian schedule.

Seneschal: On November 5th, Baroness Bec, Baron Chirhart and I will be attending Curia Regis at Crown Tourney. Curia business shall include:

1. Kingdom Event Bid Process and Committee.
2. Updating the sanctions/grievances procedure to match Corpora and current practice.

3. Territorial Baronial qualifications and pollings.
4. Symbols of rank amendment.
5. Technical corrections- numbering, spelling and grammar errors and removal of dicta.

On November 26th, Mistress Bec, Mistress Chagan and I will be traveling to Greenlion Bay to further train the Seneschal and his team. If any of the Officers of State would like to attend and offer further training, please coordinate with me.

Baron and Baroness: We have a busy fall. Next weekend is Chalice, and we have a team of baronial champions to participate. The week after that is TNT, followed by Crown Tourney, with the Greenlion Bay and Dun Carraig Investiture. The first weekend in December is Unevent, followed by Day of Dance. If you have people that you think should be recognized, please send letters to us as well as Their Majesties for Kingdom-level recognition. Since we can't see everything, it helps us to know what people are doing and what people have been up to.

Old Business

Regalia: no update

Steppingstone: no update

TNT: Port-a-pots will cost more than we originally planned. The larger-size, handicap-accessible Port-a-Pot will cost more, and the rapier and archery groups have requested that size. The extra cost will fit in the Miscellaneous category in the budget. I think we're within all of our budget guidelines. Godai contacted me this week with requests for the archers, and I unfortunately told him that we were unable to accommodate the request so close to the event. I requested last month that I would like to waive the site fee for those people who traditionally work at the event without a chance to enjoy the event.

A discussion was held. Whether this is permitted by SCA law was discussed. The burden on other supportive staff, who would not be comped, was mentioned. The volunteer nature of the jobs being done was mentioned. The ability of these folks to walk away from a position (versus support staff) and time spent outside of the event itself was brought up. The solvency of the organization given a precedent of comping was discussed.

If we do this, we need to check with Kingdom, and we need to set a policy that would apply to all events.

A motion was called by Katarzyna. A motion was made by Martelle to accept the budget amendment as outlined by Barb for this event. Wynn seconded.

The motion was declined 3-3 with Hunter and Eithne abstaining due to conflict of interest, and Phillip abstaining, and Katarzyna providing the tie-breaking vote.

Martelle raised the motion to investigate whether we should amend the Financial Policy. It has been decided to look into it.

Fall University: We do not have the final invoice from Carroll County Schools. The Exchequer has all monies collected to date, which are around \$1,300. We have expenses for food purchased for fund raiser lunch. I am expecting that we will only owe around \$400 unless the invoice is greater than I expected.

Unevent Bid: We did not get the event. Unevent will be held at St. Joseph's Church, 4590 Saint Joseph's Way in Pomfret, MD, which is about 1.5 hours away. It is about 5 miles from US301S.

Greenlion's Bay Lion's Head Tavern: We're waiting for the first things to come in, and we'll get busy. We have an enthusiastic group that's excited about doing it.

Baronial Birthday: In addition to the garb competition we will have a sekunjabin competition.

Denis Coan Contribution: Livi has agreed to coordinate the silent auction to benefit the Denis Coan scholarship fund.

Greenlion Bay January Ball Event: Here is the proposal for the Winter Ball which was emailed to the officers. This event will be autocrated and trolled by the Canton, but the event is a dry run for the dance group that holds the balls at Pennsic. They needed a spot to try a new format out and asked us. We need approval of the Board to spike.
