I. Officer reports:

A. Chatelaine: August was a strange month, very quiet in the barony, but very active on the web. Bright Hills received 6 requests for information, 3 from Carroll County. Odyssey School has requested a demo early in the school year. We presented at the old school location about 10 years ago. The meet and greet originally planned for July has been postponed until later, probably September.

F. MOAS- not much in the last month; Faye held a class on Friday on kumihimo that interacted with the woodworkers creating marudai; a headgear class was held a few weeks ago

4. Clothiers- just did a headgear class and are looking at Venetian and Burgundian garb at the Kingdom level

5. Cook's- had last meeting in July before last business meeting; did

Pennsic Social and it was a success; coming up, we have Trial by Fire, the Sunday of Labor Day weekend, at Bec's house; usually setup begins at 10, cooking begins at noon and ends at 4; Sindara is the head cook for TTNT; tentative menu is planned; have been asked to work on a bid and estimate \$9-10 per person, but final decision will be made at next meeting

6. PAGE- in the midst of preparations for Chalice competition; also trying to perform some music open to the populace so as not to be overwhelmed with play rehearsals

7. TAG- met during Pennsic; the next meeting will be the Sunday of Labor Day weekend

8. WAG- making marudai today (stands for Japanese braiding)

9. St. Mathias- occasional money coming in; next and last sale will be at TTNT; anything left after TTNT will be donated to Goodwill

G. MOL: officially, nothing in the past month

H. Webminister: no report

I. Seneshal: quiet month; everyone had a good time at Pennsic

J. Baroness: barony once again made a great impression at Pennsic for volunteering; September and October will be busy with events and Riverfest demo; will be going to War of the Wings; we have a northern king, so please send letters of recommendation; feeling poorly and looking for a successor; this time next year, letters of intent for the baronage will be needed; will be glad to meet privately with anybody who might be interested; must have three candidates according to kingdom law; barony donated arrows and a basket from the Cooks' Guild to a silent auction at Pennsic to benefit Ariel's fund; Chalice of the Sun God baronial team is organized; at Coronation, will have a baronial pavillion with the archers

A. TTnT- the event is now marked as a royal progress; will be having a tavern brawl for forces loyal to King Richard and those loyal to Prince John

Pennsic, as usual, was fun, exasperating, tiring and exhilarating. The first week had lots of rain which closed a lot of streets and the parking lot for awhile. War Week was drier and hotter. Atlantians, in general, and Bright Hillians, in particular, won praise while having fun.

This was the first major war for Bright Hillian Bill Ford who broke his leg in two places in battle on the Friday of War Week. Bill's first question when visited in the hospital was "Who won?" Bill is recovering and has attended Fighter Practice in his walking cast. After this first experience in a major war, Bill wants to fight again! Vivat Bill!

Bright Hills gained a new member at Pennsic. Angela (no SCA name yet) attended Pennsic as her first event and wants to get involved. Welcome, Angela!

Atlantian archers won kudos at Pennsic from, among others, the North Shield King who is reported to have asked "when did your archers start carrying automatic weapons?" Seamus McRay, Janyn Fletcher and Godai had the personal privilege of guarding Prince Vladd in the gate battle. Janyn Fletcher is now a Bowmen Elite in the Royal Round with an average of over 80. His rank has gone from Novice to Bowmen Elite in less than a year.

Atlantia hosted the Known World in a Social on Thursday night of War Week. The Bright Hills Cooks Guild provided bountiful and very tasty food. Under Mistress Bec's charge, more than 60 pounds of meat was served including beef, venison, pork, turkey and meatballs, all of which was cooked on-site the day of the Social. Fruits, vegetables and lots of desserts were also served.

During the Social, an auction was held to help pay medical bills for Duchess Arielle. Bright Hillians were responsible for two of the donated baskets, including a basket of kitchen related items donated by the Bright Hills Cooks' Guild.

While King Richard the Lionheart is a prisoner of the Holy Roman Emperor, Henry VI, and the minstrel Blondel is singing from castle to castle throughout the empire in search of King Richard, in England, many church men and nobles are reporting trouble with bandits in Sherwood Forest. Mistress Martelle von Charlottenburg, Baroness of Bright Hills, has marshaled her forces to hold Nottingham Castle for the rightful king and has called for a tournament and feast to celebrate the harvest. Champions will be chosen, some for their martial prowess, others for their artistry. The barony's famed cooks will offer a sumptuous feast, and from the bards shall come songs, tales and even theatrics.

Martial Activities: Heavy and Rapier tournaments, and target archery shoot, during which the baronial champions will be chosen.

Arts & Sciences Activities: Competitions will be held to select the new baronial artisan and bard.

Additional A&S competitions include: Best use of Sable & Argent (black & white, Bright Hills' colors) in any medium; item(s) in honor of King Richard, Queen Eleanor, Prince John, or Robin Hood; and "Treasures of Sherwood Forest" -- a contest for best decorated arrow. As the sponsor, Mistress Chagan Khulan says, "The reknown of the archers of Bright Hills challenges that of the famed archers of Sherwood Forest and the mighty longbowmen of England. Indeed, only the finest equipment will do! After all, what Mongol would appreciate good archery equipment?"

Thus does Chagan Khulan challenge the good folk of Atlantia to bring forth their most decorative arrows, painted by skilled and deft artisans. The competition is open to all -- adult or child -- and each competitor may enter as many arrows as they wish. (Please make sure the paint is dry!) Arrows must be SCA legal and usable. Documentation of your arrow(s) is welcome but not required. Winners will be chosen by popular vote, with one prize for competitors 13 and older, and another for those younger than 13.

For those staying overnight, there are spaces for tent camping (free), or for \$10 you can rent a bunk bed for up to two nights in one of four bedrooms in a heated dorm with bathrooms offering hot showers and outlets.

There are fireplaces in the feast hall and the covered pavilion, and we will have a supply of firewood.

Pets are permitted, if leashed and cleaned up after.

Site Restrictions: This site is DRY (no alcohol), since it is a Boy Scout camp. No smoking in any building. No gathering firewood on site.

Feast Information: The feast will be prepared by the Knowne-World-reknowned Bright Hills Cooks Guild, this time lead by Lady Sindara.

The well-loved Sekunjabin Tavern will be available in the solar of Nottingham Castle (the feast hall), as well as space for bards to congregate, sing, swap stories, share songs, and brew mischief.

General Guidelines

The Bright Hills Cooks' Guild sponsors this Challenge. The challenge is to create a period dish under the conditions found at the PENNSIC WAR. This is an opportunity for all those interested to come and cook and compete and socialize. It is also that rare opportunity to recognize that Cooking is a Spectator Sport!

Things to bring:

1. Your recipe (3 copies) and any additional documentation. (NOTE: Minimal documentation should include (a) the original recipe; (b) your redaction or translation; and (c) any notes related to changes you made in the recipe and why, information on the dish or ingredients, the cooking method, etc.)

2. All your ingredients.

3. All the pots, pans, utensils, etc., necessary to prepare your dish. This includes knives, cutting boards, serving dishes, etc. NOTE: please mark what you bring.

4. A table or other surface on which to prepare and cook your dish(es).

5. Chairs (if you wish to be seated).

6. Appropriate cooking accessories - your grill, Coleman stove, smoker, hot pads, towels, etc.

7. Your favorite liquid refreshment (the Guild will provide ice water).

Things to remember:

1. This competition is open to all.

2. Spectators are welcome.

3. Garb Please!

4. Any medications you need (bee sting kits, allergy and asthma supplies, etc.)

5. Our hosts are providing the site and outdoor facilities.

Children

1. We are in favor of them.

2. You are responsible for your own children. The Guild does not provide babysitting services.

3. There will be no designated space available for children's activities.

4. Because the competition begins early, you should plan to feed yourself lunch. Please bring what you and your family will need to survive until after the judging is complete.

Directions:

Take your best route to the Baltimore Beltway (I-695). Take the Northwest Expressway (I-795). Follow this road to the end. Turn North (left) onto Maryland Route 30 (watch for the signs to Hampstead). Hampstead is about 10 miles north. In Hampstead, go through 3 traffic lights. The house will be about ½ block past the third light, on the west (left) side of the road. (NOTE: If you get to the light at Route 482, you have gone too far.) The street address is 1022 South Main Street (which is Maryland Route 30). The house is a large gray and white Victorian, with a brick wall in front and a front porch with white pillars. There is room to park in front of the house. The telephone number is 410-239-8794.
